



Regional Express, or Rex, is Australia's largest independent regional airline. With the addition of Armidale to the airline's network on 2nd September 2004, Rex will fly more than 1000 flights every week to 30 metropolitan and regional centres across New South Wales, Victoria, Tasmania and South Australia, as well as linking the national capital Canberra to Sydney with regular daily flights.

The airline employs more than 570 staff across Australia, with its headquarters in Sydney. A large complement of Rex staff is based in regional Australia, including around 50 people at the customer contact centre in the NSW Central Western city of Orange and more than 100 staff at Rex's engineering, finance and administration centre at Wagga Wagga, the gateway to the NSW Riverina region.

Services are operated by a fleet of 27 turboprop aircraft comprising 20 34-seat SAAB 340s and seven 19-seat Metro 23s.

Rex is backed by a consortium of successful business people that specifically came together to acquire long time regional airlines Hazelton and Kendell to form Rex, which started operations in August 2002.
